



SSBG NOTICE OF FUNDING OPPORTUNITY

Davis County is opening the application period for our FY 23-24 Social Services Block Grant (SSBG). The County has approximately \$100,000 in available funding. Application period will begin May 1, 2023 and continue through 11:59pm on May 31, 2023.

The County is prioritizing innovative approaches/strategies to significantly move the needle in addressing a variety of community issues (e.g. child abuse, domestic violence, food insecurity) as they relate to the overall goals of the Social Services Block Grant. The County will consider allocating our entire SSBG award to a single project if it proposes to have a considerable impact on a priority issue. There is no guarantee of SSBG funding in subsequent years, however, if a selected project(s) shows good progress after one year, the County may prioritize the project(s) for CDBG public services funding in subsequent years.

Eligibility: Non-Profit Agencies, Davis County Non-entitlement Cities, Quasi-Government Agencies, and Davis County Departments administering direct services to qualified low-income populations.

Grant Period: July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024

SSBG Community and Support Service Programs

Funds will be used to increase education, support case management, educational & training opportunities, and foster healthier families by addressing the identified basic needs as well as fundamental housing, food, health, and safety concerns.

- **SSBG grant recipients** must have documented established guidelines and serve low and moderate income (LMI) households in Davis County. Please note that the 2023 income thresholds have not yet been published and are likely to increase. The link above is the 2022 thresholds. The 2023 thresholds will be provided once available.

Minimum and Maximum Funding Requests

SSBG Community and Support Services: Min: **\$25,000** Max: **\$100,000**

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Applications are due Wednesday, May 31, 2023 by 11:59 p.m. Applications must be submitted online through Neighborly. Incomplete, hand-delivered, emailed, mailed, faxed, or late applications will be deemed ineligible.

Grant Funds are administered and monitored through the County's Community & Economic Development. All applications must comply with the provisions of the Social Services Block Grant Act, see 42 U.S.C. § 1397 et seq. (the "Act"); and all relevant federal, state, and local laws; These funds will be awarded to participating cities and nonprofit organizations which provide services to low-and moderate income (LMI) persons living in Davis County.
