SPECIAL RULES:

1. Exhibitors may make 1 entry in each class, with a limit of 5 entries per family.
2. The committee shall have the right to replace or remove any exhibit, or part of exhibit, that has become unsightly, does not meet standards or is infested. Exhibits with insects or diseases will not be allowed in competition.
3. Exhibitors must have own container. No cans, fruit jars, or beverage bottles will be accepted unless the labels have been removed or covered.
4. Entries must be correctly named and labeled. Correctness in naming will be a factor in the judging process.
5. Floriculture entries for Divisions A & B must have been grown by the exhibitor.

6. No artificial flowers will be allowed with the entry.
7. All exhibitors are responsible for filling their containers with water before leaving.
8. All junior entries will be judged separately and exclusive from the adult open class.
9. Foliage must be clean, but not polished with wax **or oil**.
10. Entries and ribbons may be picked up by exhibitors after 6:30 pm on Saturday, August 20, 2016. Those items not claimed at closing that evening will be disposed of.
11. Entries will be accepted for either the general category **OR** the 4-H category – **NOT BOTH**.

SPECIAL RULES:

- 1. Only 1 entry for each class per exhibitor. Total numbers of horticulture entries are limited to 15 per exhibitor.
- 2. Only 5 exhibits may be entered under each class from exhibitors residing at the same address.
- 3. The exhibitor must have grown all produce entered in Davis County.
- 4. **Produce should be free from blemish and will be judged on uniformity and marketability (correct number of fruit or vegetable, correct classification, etc. Bigger isn't always better.)**
- 5. All exhibits must be tagged as to variety, name & address of exhibitor.
- 6. All junior entries will be judged separately and exclusive from the adult open class.
- 7. Each exhibit shall be packed or placed in a tray or plate furnished by the Fair Committee. Trays are approx. 12" x 14".
- 8. All vegetables should be firm, cleaned but not polished with wax or oil, and arranged and exhibited in an attractive manner.

9. The chairperson shall have the right to remove at any time any exhibit or part of an exhibit that has become unsightly, does not meet standards or is infested with disease or insects.

10. Entries and ribbons may be picked up by exhibitors after 6:30 pm on Saturday, August 20, 2016. Those items not claimed at closing that evening will be disposed of.

11. Entries will be accepted for either the general category **OR** the 4-H category – **NOT BOTH**.
