# **Utah Leads Together 2.0: Low Risk**

The following face covering guidance applies to employees and volunteers:

### Face Coverings (e.g. mask, scarf, gaiter, bandana) in the Workplace

- Face coverings should be worn in settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain, such as when interacting with the public or other employees within a six-foot distance
- Cloth face coverings should not be placed on anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance
- Face coverings do not replace preventive measures such as social distancing and handwashing

### **How to Wear Face Coverings**

- To properly wear a face covering, please follow these instructions and watch the video:
