As the community moves through phased risk guidance, we encourage you to continue to implement protective measures to slow the spread of COVID-19 in our community. We understand that each facility is unique and operates under different circumstances. The guidance does not address every situation. Adaptation may be needed for your setting. Please work with your employees and patrons to implement the following:

PHYSICAL DISTANCING

When services are not being directly provided, 6 feet of physical distance must be maintained, this
includes in waiting areas and between clients at all times

CLEANING & HYGIENE

- Clean and sanitize all equipment and supplies between each patron
 - Allow extra time between appointments to sanitize all surfaces between services
 - Discourage shared use of supplies and other common tools
- Service provider should wash hands frequently, before and after patrons

SERVICE PROVIDER & PATRON PROTECTION

- Adhere to the Individual Guidance and General Business Guidance
- Both service providers and clients wear face coverings
 - Exception given for clients when mask interferes with service
- Symptom checking (checklist or verbal), including temperature checks when feasible, of all staff at the beginning of each shift, with a log that that can be made available for inspection by health department
- Exclude anyone who is sick from working
- Prohibit employees who have been instructed to isolate or quarantine from working until given health department clearance
- Screen clients upon entering the facility with a questionnaire asking about symptoms, travel, and any sicknesses at home
- Service provider maintains log of appointments with customer contact information to assist with contact tracing efforts
- Encourage contactless payment; clean financial transaction equipment in between each charge
