### H1N1 Vaccination Clinics Open For General Public In Davis County

(Layton, Utah) – Davis County Health Department’s H1N1 vaccination clinics are now open to the county’s general public. The vaccine is free but a ticket is required to receive a vaccination.

According to Lewis Garrett, director of the Davis County Health Department, “The number of people requesting the vaccine in the targeted populations has declined both last week and this week. As a result of that declining demand and the steadily increasing supply of vaccine, we are now able to make the H1N1 vaccine available for our general population.”

“The targeted populations are still encouraged to come in to any of our specially scheduled H1N1 vaccination clinics along with the general public,” he said. “Also, parents and caregivers of children 6 months to 9 years old are reminded to get their children their H1N1 booster vaccination when there’s been at least 28 days from the first dose.”

The Davis County Health Department is running H1N1 vaccination clinics on Wednesday (12/2/09) and Thursday (12/3/09), 3-8 p.m., at the Davis Conference Center, 800 West Heritage Park Boulevard, in Layton. Tickets are still available and will be handed out starting at 10 a.m. each day at the clinic location only.

The targeted populations include pregnant women; household contacts or caregivers of a child younger than 6 months, people age 6 months to 24 years; health care or emergency medical services workers; and anyone age 25-64 years old who has a health condition associated with higher risk of medical complications from influenza, such as heart, lung or kidney disease, diabetes, neurologic and neuromuscular conditions, weakened immune system, or if your physician states that you are at high risk.
