

GOVERNING THE LICENSING AND OPERATION OF DOG KENNELS

- ___ 1. The kennel area consists of such buildings, shelters, runways, and other facilities or equipment as may pertain to the operations of the kennels and all such buildings, shelters, runways, and other facilities or equipment shall be confined in the kennel area.

- ___ 2. All runways, fenced areas, or exercise spaces provided for dogs in kennels have:
(a) a smooth, impervious surface; graded to drain; or (b) a minimum of 4 inches of clean sand; or (c) a minimum of 4 inches of clean pea gravel; or (d) a minimum of 4 inches of clean sand and pea gravel over the entire area of such runway, area, or space.

- ___ 3. All droppings, bones, food scraps, papers, other trash, debris or waste incidental to the operation of the kennel are cleaned up daily, disposed of in a manner approved by the Board of Health. Droppings, bones, or paper used on kennel floors are placed in tight, impervious containers with close fitting lids pending removal, or buried to a depth of not less than 2 feet.

- ___ 4. No burning or incineration of droppings, bones, or papers from dog kennels.

- ___ 5. The shelter portion of all kennels is of such construction as is approved by the Environmental Health Services Division of the Board of Health, shall be of such construction, material, and size as to provide proper cleaning, ventilation, location, and sanitary environment for the type of dog to be housed within.

- ___ 6. Foodstuffs are kept or stored in a clean and sanitary manner in such containers or placed as will prevent the breeding of rodents or insects in or near such materials.

- ___ 7. Adequate insect and fly control measures are maintained during the months that such insects or flies are prevalent.
