



NEW RABBIT PARENT



Tips for your newly adopted family member.

Diet

Hay is 80-90% of a rabbit's daily diet. They can also have 1/4 to 1/2 cup of pellets per day. Fresh, leafy greens can be given in moderation - cilantro, romaine lettuce, and spinach are encouraged! Carrots and fruit are considered snacks.



Housing

Rabbits need room to move around and exercise! An exercise pen is a great "home base" for your rabbit, with some added in free-roam time. Rabbits can be litter trained. Since they are prey animals, hidey holes make them feel safe!

Vet Care

Rabbits are considered exotic animals. It's important to find a rabbit-savvy vet and understand that trips to the vet will cost more than a cat or dog. Keep an eye on changes in your rabbit's eating and drinking habits.

Socializing


Rabbits are social critters, but they don't get along with every-bunny!


Rabbits have a scent gland in their chin that they rub on items that they want to claim as their own.

Lifespan



Your rabbit will be around for a while! The average rabbit lifespan is 8-12 years. The oldest rabbit on record lived to 18!

Rabbits are constantly eating, which means that they are constantly producing! A rabbit can produce as many as 360 droppings per day.
