

About these numbers...


As you can see, the largest part of the shelter's population are strays.



Outcome Summary

- ACDC cared for a total of 424 animals this month.
- 145 pets were adopted via both on-site appointments and off-site adoption events.
- 87 animals were returned to their owners.
- 61 pets were returned to their owner in the field by an Animal Control Officer.
- 16 animals were humanely euthanized.
- 62 of our animals were cared for by Fosters.

Field Summary

- ACDC Officers responded to a total of 968 calls.
- 401 calls were investigations such as potential cruelty or neglect, aggressive animals, license violations, and animal bites.
- 140 calls were responding to loose or stray animals.
- 290 calls were nuisance complaints such as excessive barking, excessive feces, fence aggression, leash law violation, and license enforcement.
