WORK SESSION DISCUSSION

Senate Bill (SB) 25 Property Tax Deferral Amendments—Presented by Curtis Koch, Clerk/Auditor

Curtis said this bill started two years ago but was passed by the legislature this year. It allows individuals 75 years or older during the year of application to defer property taxes until the property is sold or they die, and the estate takes it over. Other criteria have to be met before taxes can be deferred. This bill indicates that a county may implement this in its policies. Curtis suggested the County decide whether they will make the implementation or not. Likely, on January 1, 2025, that language will change to shall.

Curtis pointed out the other qualifications that need to be met in addition to the age requirement. (These are the highlighted portions on pages 3-4.) This legislation was presented at the recently held Utah Association of Counties (UAC) Spring Conference and raised some questions and concerns among the Treasurers, Recorders, Auditors, and others in attendance. He said the legislature has created another abatement program with this bill but has given no direction on administering it and left it open to interpretation. It was pointed out to the legislature, on multiple occasions, that other tax deferral programs exist, but it did not stop them from creating this new program.

The Assessor recommended not implementing this program until required. The hope is to get the Tax Commission involved to be given rule-making authority to answer these questions and have a uniform and consistent program across the board. The Commissioners will not be implementing this right now. Mark said he would keep the Commissioners updated if anything changed.
