

COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES – DAVIS COUNTY

COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES September 13, 2022

The Board of Davis County Commissioners met for their regularly scheduled meeting at 10:00 a.m. on September 13, 2022 in room 303 of the Davis County Administration Building, 61 South Main Street, Farmington, Utah. Required legal notice of this meeting was given.

Present on the dais were: Commissioner Randy B. Elliott, Chair; Commissioner Bob J Stevenson; Curtis Koch, Clerk/Auditor; and Neal Geddes, Chief Civil Deputy County Attorney.

Excused: Commissioner Lorene Kamalu

All documents from this meeting are on file in the Davis County Clerk/Auditor's Office. The agenda for this meeting is incorporated into the minutes as item headers.

OPENING

The meeting convened at 10:00 a.m. and Human Resources Director Chris Bone led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

The public was invited to make comments to the Commission.

Rhonda Perkes from Congressman Chris Stewart's Office provided a few small updates from the Congressman's Office to the Commission. She advised that she attended the 9/11 event that was held at the Legacy Events Center last week. Congressman Stewart was out of town, however, he is planning to attend another time while the event is there. Rhonda advised that Congress is in session the entire month of September and Congressman Stewart is on a plane today heading there. She added that Congress will be working more weeks than normal due to the majority of Congress running in the elections. Rhonda advised that Congressman Stewart was in the Middle East last week, spending time in Cutter, Jordan, Israel, and Saudi Arabia on a CODEL (Congressional Delegation) assignment. It was noted that the Congressman has been working on a lot of things with the intel committee as well as listening to a lot of constituents complain about inflation. Rhonda noted that the Congressman firmly believes the answer to inflation is for Congress to stop hemorrhaging lots and lots of money the United States does not have.

1. Ordinance amending portions of Section 14.04.259A Article E Flood Damage Protection — Presented by Community and Economic Development Director Kent Andersen

It was explained that FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) has been conducting a flood study throughout Davis County and around the Great Salt Lake over the last six years. FEMA has finalized their modifications to the Flood Insurance Rate Maps and those maps will become effective September 15, 2022. Prior to this effective date, Davis County must adopt or revise the local flood management regulations and that is what is being proposed today to essentially incorporate that date and make any additional modifications that FEMA has required.

Kent advised that FEMA has reviewed the Ordinance and found it acceptable in meeting their requirements. It was noted that the importance of having this in place and in good standing is that it allows the residents of Davis County to purchase flood insurance, which is considered vital for the community. It was explained that Davis County does not have many structures that have been affected. Kent stated that he notified three structures which were barns, etc.

Kent advised the Ordinance has been posted in nine different locations across the County. Commissioner Elliott asked if there were any comments regarding the Ordinance posting. Kent advised there were no comments, that most of the impact of this Ordinance will occur within the individual cities, and that the City Floodplain Administrators will address any comments. It was explained that this Ordinance is only for the unincorporated areas of Davis County.

The ordinance begins 09/13/2022.
