WORK SESSION DISCUSSION

Discussion surrounding a new ordinance allowing Davis County residents to purchase an additional dog permit from Animal Care of Davis County—Presented by Ashleigh Young, Animal Care Director

Ashleigh said she met with all the city managers on September 1, 2022. They are working toward having a unified County ordinance for dogs and cats. They all agreed there should be an additional dog permit, which is the first step in that unified ordinance. She presented a draft of the Annual Additional Dog Permit to the Commission.

She reviewed the requirements for the permit. It will allow owners one more pet than the standard allowance number (that number has yet to be decided.) Ashleigh would like to set the fee somewhere between \$50-\$100 but wants the Commission's input. They agreed she should give them a recommendation. She asked if the Commission is comfortable with allowing four dogs per household. (The County Ordinance currently allows three.)
