



2026 NOTICE OF FUNDING OPPORTUNITY

Davis County Community and Economic Development will soon be accepting applications for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), the Home Investment Partnership Program (HOME) and the Social Services Block Grant for our upcoming program year that will begin on July 1, 2026.

Required Training: A required training for CDBG, HOME, and SSBG applicants will be held on January 7, 2026 from 11:30am – 1:00pm. The training will be held at the Davis County Administration Building located at 61 S. Main Street, Farmington, UT 84025 Rm 306. All applicants interested in applying will need to attend in-person or virtually.

Eligibility: Non-profit agencies, non-entitlement cities, quasi-government agencies, affordable housing developers, and County departments located in Davis County and/or serving Davis County residents are eligible to apply.

Income Qualifications and Service Area: CDBG and HOME recipients must conduct projects/activities that serve clients at or below 80% AMI, who live in the "Urban County" area. Income thresholds will be distributed when released in April 2026. CDBG projects located in Layton or Clearfield are ineligible unless serving the greater Davis County community. HOME projects can take place anywhere in Davis County.

Project Types

Home Investment Partnership (HOME)

(Affordable Housing Development, Home Rehabilitation, Rental Assistance)

Funds will be used to support affordable housing development including acquisition and new construction, homeowner (owner-occupied) rehabilitation, homeownership assistance (grants/loans to purchase homes), and tenant-based rental assistance.

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

(Housing, Public Facility, and Infrastructure Improvements)

Funds will be used to support housing choices through home improvement programs, homeownership, land acquisition for affordable housing development; neighborhood revitalization and improvements to infrastructure or public facilities.

Community and Social Service Programs

(CDBG Public Services and Social Services Block Grant {SSBG})

Funds will be used to increase education, support case management, educational & training opportunities, and foster healthier families by addressing basic needs as well as fundamental housing, food, health, and safety concerns.
