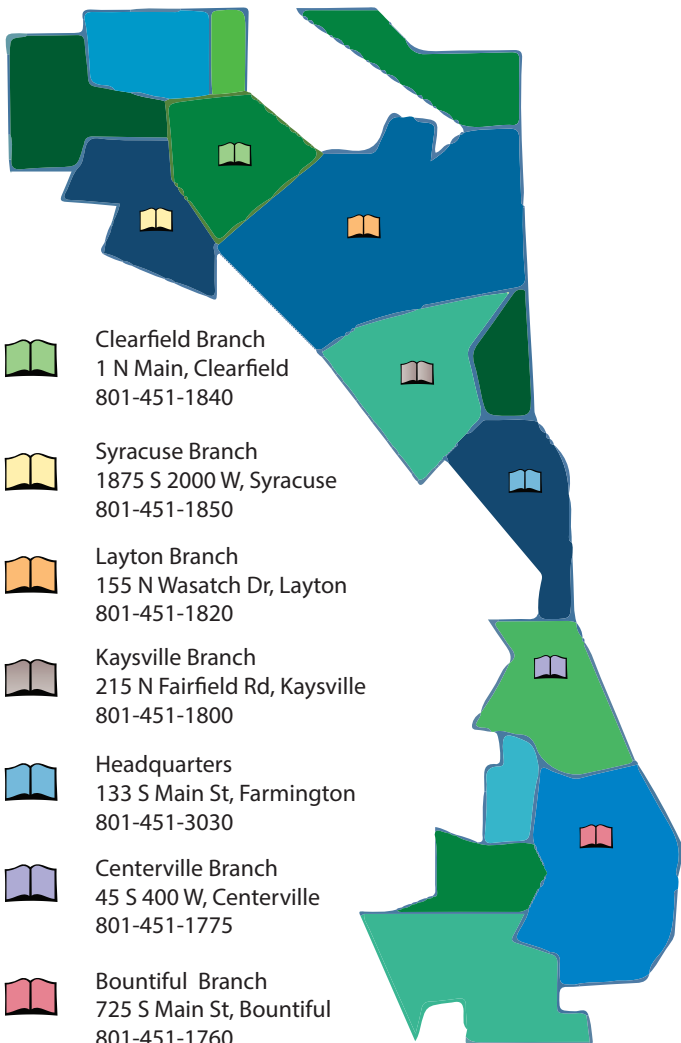

## THE YEAR IN REVIEW

In 2022, the Davis County Library embraced technology by introducing meeting room scheduling software and giving patrons the ability to pay fees via credit card. The Library rejoined the Beehive Library Consortium, supplying more statewide Libby electronic titles, and introduced Hoopla, a streaming service offering free access to videos, graphic novels, music, eBooks and eAudio. The Library redesigned and upgraded its website, providing patrons with improved hands-on usability. In conjunction with the Salt Lake Astronomical Society and a grant from Rocky Mountain Power, each branch received a telescope enabling patrons to view the celestial realms from their own homes.

The Library conducted a third-party public survey, obtaining more than 13,000 responses from Davis County residents. In addition to the annual Summer Reading Program, the Library also welcomed authors Jason F. Wright, Ben Behunin, Rachel Rueckert, and hosted a Proper Romance Panel. Other notable events included a moon rock exhibit from NASA, various waterwise gardening presentations and National Library Week programs featuring the Magic Tree House book series.
