Utah Leads Together 2.0: Moderate Risk

The following face covering guidance applies to employees and volunteers:

Face Coverings (e.g. mask, scarf, gaiter, bandana) in the Workplace

- Face coverings do not replace preventive measures such as social distancing and handwashing
- Individuals should stay 6 feet away from others even when wearing a face covering
- Face coverings should be worn in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain, such as when interacting with the public
- Use of face coverings by employees that do not interact with the public is voluntary
- High-risk individuals should wear face coverings at all times when in public settings
- Cloth face coverings should not be placed on anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance
