



As of April 1, Davis County is in a Moderate Level of Transmission according to [Utah Transmission Index metrics](#). We are inching closer to a low level of transmission each time the measures are reviewed.

- 7-day average percent positivity: 3.09% (low level:  $\leq 5.0\%$ )
- 14-day case rate per 100K population: 165.41/100,000 (low level:  $\leq 100/100K$ )
- Statewide ICU utilization (7-day average): 65.1% (low level:  $\leq 68.9\%$ ); Statewide COVID-19 ICU utilization (7-day average): 10.65% (low level:  $\leq 5.9\%$ )
- A transmission level (high, moderate, low) is determined if a county has two of the three metrics in the designated level of transmission.

Davis County will maintain a mask policy in county facilities for the time being.

- This is temporary until all employees and residents who want a vaccine are able to receive one.
- All Utahns ages 16 and older are eligible to get the vaccine. However, the current constraint is the limited amount of vaccine doses that are available. We expect more doses of vaccine and more vaccine providers will come to our community in the coming weeks.
- We ask for respect to all businesses that choose to require masks in the coming weeks.
- We gratefully acknowledge the efforts of our employees and residents who have done all things necessary to help bring this pandemic to an end by wearing masks, maintaining physical distance, limiting gathering size, practicing good hygiene, staying home when sick, protecting those most vulnerable, and getting vaccinated.

Vaccinations are the key to our recovery. They are the way we will be able to return to normal life again. As of March 29, vaccination rates in Davis County show that a very high percentage of our most vulnerable age groups are now fully vaccinated.

- 70+: 81.8%
- 65-69: 63.4%
- General Population: 16.6%

In addition to the Davis County Health Department vaccine clinics, there are many vaccine providers in Davis County and throughout the state.

We have made significant progress toward preventing the spread of COVID-19 in our community. We are optimistic that we will be able to return to regular business practices in the coming months. We are trending in the right direction.
